CRISIS AS PEDAGOGY: RECOMMENDATIONS FOR USING THE PANDEMIC IN LEADERSHIP EDUCATION

Dr. Brett Whitaker, chair and associate professor of leadership studies, and Dr. Lori Kniffin, assistant professor of leadership studies, recently published an article in the Journal of Leadership Education. The article outlines some of the pedagogical considerations for using a chaotic and trauma-filled set of experiences, such as those experienced during the pandemic, to teach leadership concepts.

Dr. Abeni El-Amin, assistant professor of management and economics, recently published an article in Progress in Industrial Ecology, An International Journal. Among the article's recommendations are for nursing homes to establish advisory committees of stakeholders for disaster preparedness and to increase preparedness training of all staff, first respondents, residents of capability, and residents' guardians.
