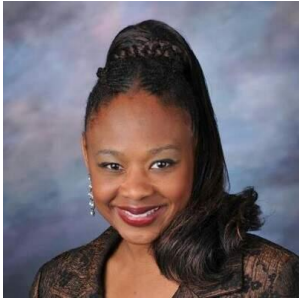

### [NEW ELASMOSAURID SPECIMEN \(PLESIOSAURIA: SAUROPTERYGIA\) FROM THE LATE CRETACEOUS OF COLORADO AND KANSAS AND THEIR BEARING ON ELASMOSAURID LINEAGES OF THE WESTERN INTERIOR SEAWAY](#)

Paleontologists Bruce A. Schumacher and Michael J. Everhart, Adjunct Curators for the Sternberg Museum of Natural History, recently published an article detailing their discovery of an entirely new species of elasmosaur while reviewing an old elasmosaurid specimen, known as the 'Holyrood elasmosaur.' The Holyrood elasmosaur was collected by George F. Sternberg and Myrl V. Walker in 1931 in Ellsworth County near the small town of Holyrood. In honor of Myrl V. Walker, the new genus and species has been named *Plesioelasmosaurus walkeri*.
