

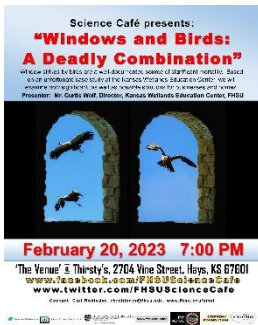

FHSU'S NEXT SCIENCE CAFÉ SET FOR FEB. 20

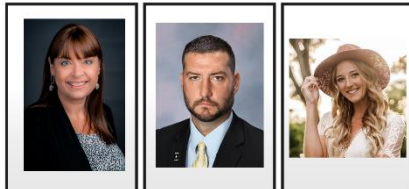
