In 2022, FHSU received an ERASMUS+ Exchange grant with RISEBA, a university in Riga, Latvia. This grant allowed two FHSU students and one RISEBA student to live and learn at each other's institutions for the Spring 2023 term. Faculty and staff were also given the opportunity to participate in the exchange. RISEBA sent five staff members between March-July 2023 to visit and learn from FHSU. In June 2023, FHSU sent three staff members and one faculty member to Riga. During the exchanges, future collaborations were explored, academic operations were explored, and the rich history and culture of the different countries were experienced.
